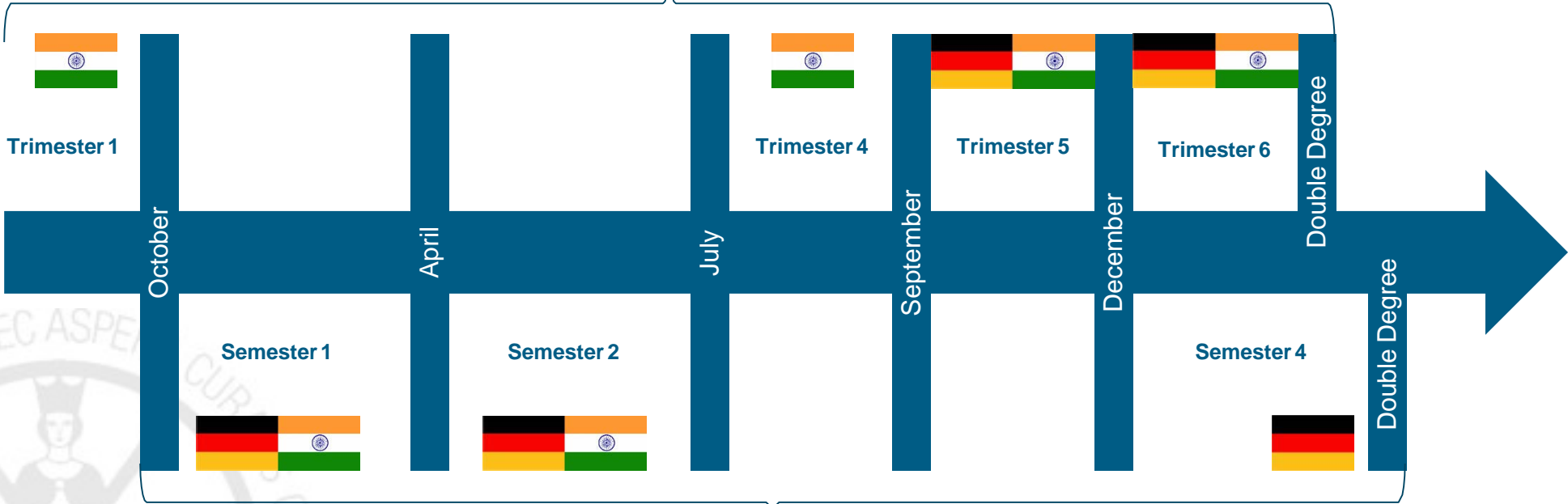

Admission requirements to RCBS / KU double degree program (before going on exchange)

WFI students

- Must have completed a 3-year Bachelor's degree (usually 180 ECTS) which includes business-related courses (e.g. on general management, statistics, economics, etc.) to ensure a basic understanding of management science.
- Must be full-time KU M. Sc. students
- Must have passed all semester 1 and 2 credits (60 ECTS, corresponds to 54 RCBS CP)

RCBS students

- Must have completed a 3-year Bachelor's (usually 36 courses with a total of 120 local CP) which included business-related courses (e.g. on general management, statistics, economics, etc.) to ensure a basic understanding of management science.
- Must be full-time PGDM students at RCBS
- Must have passed all trimester 1 credits (18 RCBS CP, corresponds to 20 ECTS, including business related courses such as statistics, economics and principles of management etc.)



Study abroad rules

- All participating students must **adhere to the rules and regulations of their home and host institutions**
- Participating students shall **not attend courses at the host institution which they have already attended** at their home institution
- Participating students shall **not take part in further study abroad activities** (such as additional study abroad semesters) **between KU and RCBS** outside of this agreement
- Bachelor (“undergraduate”)- courses are **not allowed to be taken nor is it allowed to take courses from trimester 1 – 3**
- For German students going to India: All **compulsory courses** (“Pflichtkurse”) must be **passed at WFI**
- **Students are responsible for their choice of courses**



Graduation requirements to obtain the degree at the host institution

- Must obtain 60 ECTS (worth 54 RCBS CP) in semesters 1 and 2 at WFI/KU, must comply with all the mandatory or compulsory elective courses (including Studium Pro)
- Must validate two major specializations and complete all necessary academic workload of 27 RCBS CP (corresponds to 30 ECTS) in trimester 5 and 6 at RCBS
- Must write a master thesis (30 ECTS, corresponds to 27 RCBS CP) in semester 4 at WFI with the support of a RCBS instructor and an India-related topic and relevant academic research



- **Upon successful completion of the program...**

- **Indian students** receive – in addition to their PGDM – a Master of Science (M. Sc.) degree from WFI
- **WFI students** receive – in addition to their M. Sc. – a PGDM from RCBS
- To receive both degrees, it is **crucial to precisely follow both institutions' rules and regulations and at WFI to apply for the issuing your certificate (Zeugnis)**



Graduation requirements to obtain the degree at the host institution

- Must obtain 18 RCBS CP in trimester 1 at RCBS
- Must obtain 60 ECTS (corresponds to 54 RCBS CP) during semesters 1 and 2 at WFI, including 6 mandatory modules
- Must complete an internship and report (worth 3 RCBS CP) between semesters 1 and 2 at WFI; the internship will be graded at RCBS based on the internship report
- Must obtain 24 RCBS CP (corresponds to 27 ECTS) in trimester 4-6 at RCBS
- Must write a dissertation (worth 13 RCBS CP, corresponds to 15 ECTS) in semester 6 at RCBS with remote support by a WFI instructor and a Germany-related topic and relevant academic research
- It is not allowed to take bachelor courses for double degree students (there are very few exceptions, ask student advisory service before considering that)
- After having obtained all required credits, students have to apply for the WFI Certificate (Zeugnis) to be issued. It will not be issued automatically

Grade Requirements to obtain the degrees

- To obtain WFI's **M. Sc.** degree, students must generally score at least a passing grade (WFI: "4.0"; RCBS: "C") in every module. A student may apply to obtain the M. Sc. degree if only one module was marked failed (KU: "5.0"; RCBS: "D" or "F") based on the rules outlined in the examination procedures ("M. Sc. Prüfungsordnung").
- To obtain RCBS' **PGDM** degree, students must generally score at least a passing grade (RCBS: "C"; KU: "4.0") in individual examinations and an overall Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 5.5 or above. A student can have a maximum of 2 courses marked with a "D" or 1 course marked with an "F" grade in an academic year for the successful completion of the PGDM.

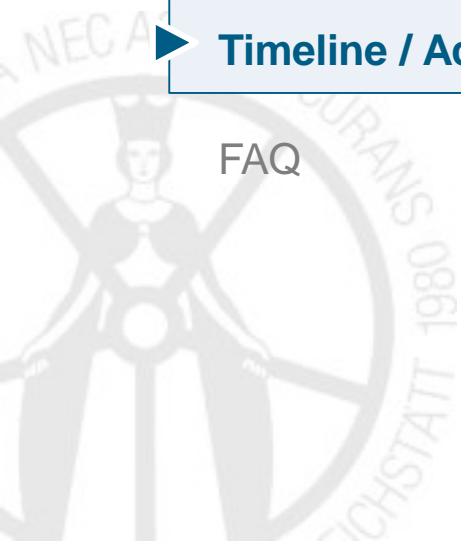

FAQ

1. How proficient do I need to be in English?

Currently, English level B2 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) is required.

2. Do I have to pay tuition fees? What else do I have to pay?

WFI and RCBS have agreed to waive tuition for participating in this program. However, WFI will have to charge membership fees (currently €56,00) in behalf of the “Studentenwerk”, an entity which provides subsidized student services (such as cafeteria & restaurant). WFI is not entitled to waive these fees, because all students legally have to be members of “Studentenwerk”. Thus, you do not have to pay tuition fees but any other costs (travel, accommodation, cost of living etc.) will be at your expense.

3. Where will I stay during my studies at RCBS?

At the RCBS guest students usually have the opportunity to stay in an international students’ house located close to campus (see description below). RCBS’ IO will provide support in arranging accommodation.

4. Who will support me locally?

Both institutions have a student buddy system, local IO and a liaison manager to support students from the partner university. For general questions, students should first seek support by their student buddy before contacting the IO or the liaison manager.

5. What should I do if I need to extend my studies (illness before / during my stay abroad or insufficient grades)?

Both institutions accept the partner institution's local rules and procedures (e.g. as outlined in KU's "M.Sc. Prüfungsordnung") for a possible extension of studies due to

- (chronic) illness or
- insufficient grades of a student.

At WFI, students suffering from illness and requesting to extend the time of an examination or postpone it may be asked to obtain a medical certificate by a doctor chosen by the institution.

In the case of insufficient grades (at RCBS: "D" or "F"; at WFI: "5.0"), students may repeat their exam twice at WFI and once at RCBS before a course is finally determined as "failed". Students who have obtained non-passing grades are generally responsible for fulfilling any local requirements (e.g. physical presence) when repeating an exam. Exceptions may only be granted within the institution's examination rules and procedures

6. How should I prepare for my stay abroad?

Besides logistical details (visa, housing, vaccination, transportation, transcripts etc.), it is important to prepare culturally for the study abroad. This may include additional language training or reading about local culture, customs, geography, and law. In addition, students should frequently interact with their Indian program mates. For logistical planning, please get in touch with the IO early. All other preparation is expected to be performed autonomously by students.



7. How should I behave when studying at RCBS?

As guests and representatives of the WFI, all participating students have to strictly comply with any local rules and regulations provided by RCBS, law or government officials. This applies to all behavior and particularly to the use of alcohol and drugs. Smoking in public is not allowed in India. Do not hide yourself while smoking.

8. Are scholarships available to support the program?

Please note that students in this program recently had problems obtaining Auslands-BAföG.

Students can apply individually with the DAAD (<https://www2.daad.de/ausland/studieren/stipendium/de/70-stipendien-finden-und-bewerben/>), with BayIND (<https://www.bayind.de/de/programme-foerderungen/>), Ku IntAid (<https://www.ku.de/international/studierende-der-ku/studienaufenthalt-im-ausland/finanzierung/foerderung-durch-die-ku/ku-intaid>), policy-related or other scholarship providers.

9. Can I continue my studies in India after having graduated with the PGDM?

Generally no. The PGDM is a practice-oriented degree similar to the MBA and does not automatically qualify for e.g. doctoral studies.
